Covid Update

Vice Chancellors statement 26/2/2020

Following the introduction of the Government Road map to recovery and following Department of Education guidance, the Vice Chancellor announced that there will be no imminent change to current plans for students return to the University:

Lateral flow testing

The University is to stop offering lateral flow testing kits. Apparently the kits, which enabled staff to self-administer a Covid virus test, are considered to be too unreliable.

Formal Dispute

In partnership with sister unions, Unite has registered a formal national dispute with the combined university negotiating body (UCEA) over their failure to offer a 2021 pay rise. Unite remains a central part of the national framework negotiating body (JNCHES).
